





### Educational Approach:

1. Individualized Learning Plan for all scholars.
2. High expectations for student achievement.

### Academic Measures:

**NWEA MAP**—This assessment is taken by all scholars in grades K-8 as a nationally normed reference assessment to have an understanding of how scholars are performing as compared to their peers.

**i-Ready**—A computer assessment for scholars in grades K-8 in reading and math. Teachers use this data to plan daily instruction and is used daily by all scholars. The scholars test in reading and math and teachers analyze this data, create groups, and differentiate within their classrooms.

**DIBELS**—Scholars in grades K-2 participate to assess level of literacy skills for each scholar.


**ORF (Oral Reading Fluency)** - Scholars from grade 2-8 participate using a grade level text that is timed for one minute to see how many words per minute the scholar is able to read.

**Diagnostic Screener**—Ohio's diagnostic is given to scholars in grades K-3 as a measure of whether or not a scholar is on track in reading, writing, and math.

**AIR State Assessment**—Scholars in grade 3-8 are tested to assess mastery of Ohio's Learning Standards. The results are used to strengthen future instruction.

### Curriculum:

Reading and Math followed Engage New York as our curriculum for all grades K-8. Science utilized Glencoe resources throughout the school year.

During its fifth year of operation, Canton College Preparatory School has evolved to solidify its status as a viable educational option for the community of Canton. The K-8 campus had 189 students enrolled in October 2017 and maintained a 96% retention rate as 181 students were enrolled in May 2018. Academic achievement was evident through the State Report Cards that were released in September 2018. The school earned a C as an overall school grade and an A for improving at-risk K-3 readers. Of the 26 schools within Canton city limits (22 public and 4 charter), only 2 earned a higher overall school grade and no other schools earned higher than a C for improving at-risk K-3 readers. Additionally, 86.4% of the school's third graders met the Third Grade Reading Guarantee requirements for promotion to 4th grade on the fall and/or spring assessment. Facilitation of a summer testing session resulted in a total of 27/29 students (93.1%) hitting the promotion requirements.

The development of implementation of various afterschool programming also supported the overall development of the students of Canton College Prep. These programs include, but are not limited to: volleyball, K-4 cheerleading, 5-8 cheerleading, boys basketball, girls basketball, ballroom dance, 'Just us Girls' (community service group), COMMIT to be FIT (fitness club), and academic tutoring. As a result of the cultural and academic achievements experienced in the 2017-18 school year, the school's enrollment has grown from 181 in May 2018 to 276 in September 2018.
