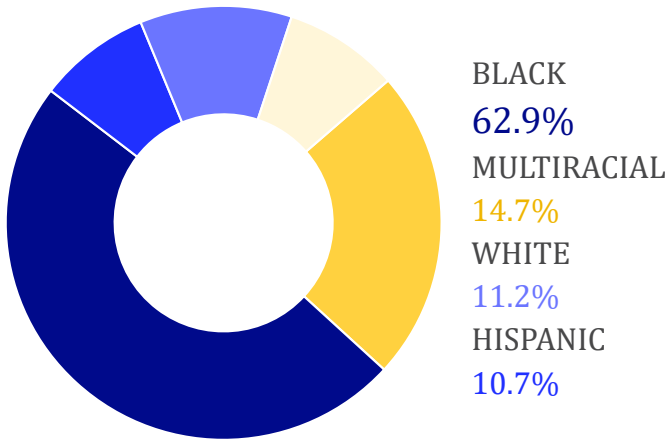

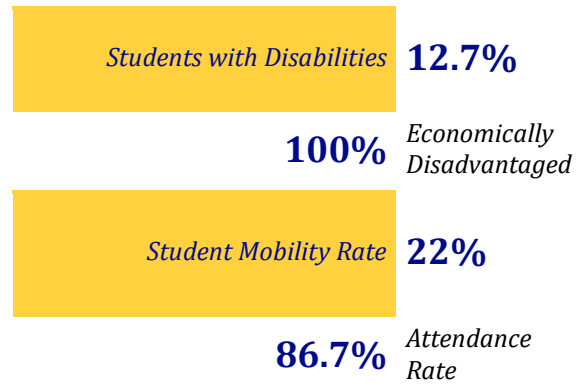


Student Demographics

Progress towards Goals

Student proficiency in **ELA** has increased over the past two years, from **30.1%** in SY 2023 to **32.2%** in SY 2025.

Over the same time period, **Math** proficiency has increased from **17.7%** to **38%**.

The number of **discipline occurrences** has decreased by **45%** from 2024 to 2025.

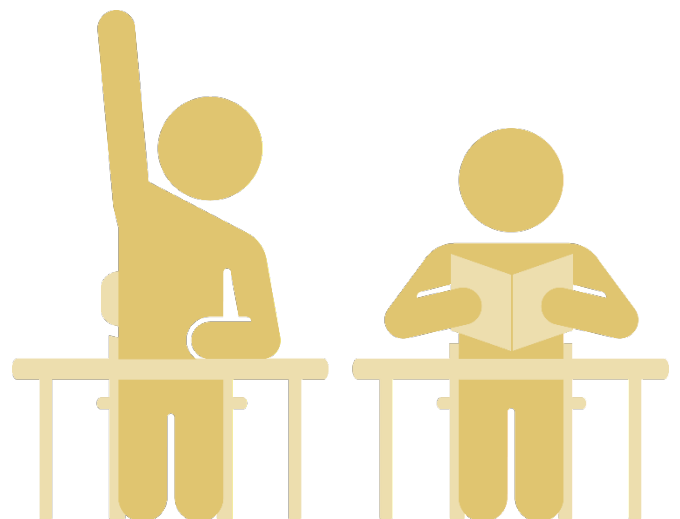
Our Academic Goals

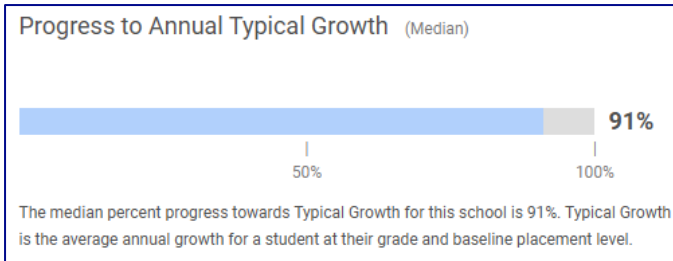




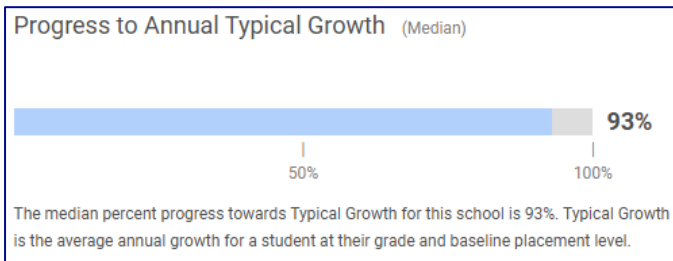

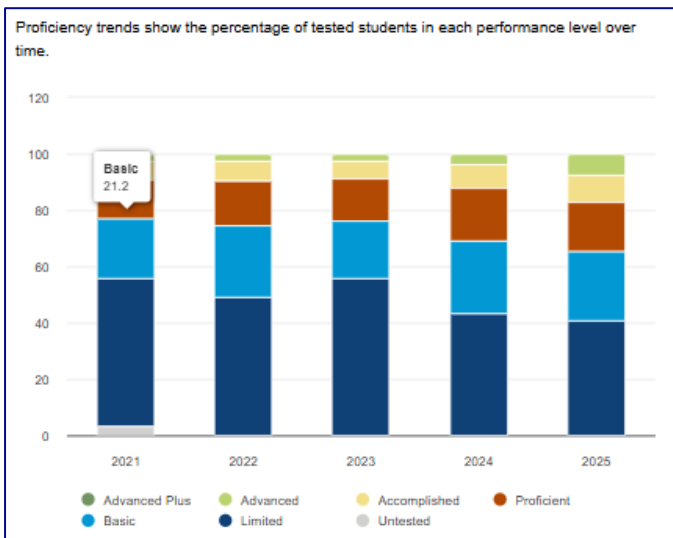
iReady Data Reading
